Each community received guidance to strengthen its legal capacity and a specific set of tools (*Roadmap*). These solutions can be implemented with local funds or in cooperation with non-governmental organizations, through participation in projects and attraction of grant funding.



The project has fostered new inter-municipal ties between participating communities. In particular, the lawyers of *Shyroke village council* shared the experience of how their community addresses legal concerns of people, how the village council manages the hotline on legal issues and why it important.



Project objectives: to explain local development processes to people and promote public oversight of the implementation of communities' strategies.

Overall project purpose: to increase openness and transparency of the community development processes in eastern Ukraine.

Innovations and impacts

Most partner communities performed **first-ever** monitoring of their development strategies, even though they had approved these documents a few years ago. Also, local councils succeeded in involving active citizens and NGOs in the monitoring process.

Development of social capital of civic initiatives in Ukrainian regions

Project of the Kyiv Dialogue platform, financially supported by the Federal Foreign Office of Germany.

In 2021, STEP was an implementing partner of the project in Zaporizhzhia region.

Kyiv Dialogue was founded in 2005 as a platform to enhance the dialogue and collaboration between Germany and Ukraine. The program supports local organizations and civic initiatives, which contribute to democratic reforms in Ukraine. In 2021, five more regional NGOs became partners of the Kyiv Dialogue.

Project activities included training in Zaporizhzhia, networking seminars in Vasylivka and Melitopol and a small grants competition.

In Vasylivka, activists painted murals in a highway underpass to encourage people to use a tunnel instead of crossing the road in a very dangerous place. As a result, the city not only got a new photo zone. But also public attention motivated the local council to allocate funds to repair the old underpass.

270+ girls and boys aged 5-17 participated in road safety meetings that were held in schools of Vasylivka.





Active youth from Plodorodne conducted a series of environmental education activities, including lectures for school students and meetings with environmental activists. The initiative group also prepared tips on waste sorting & recycling for village schools, cultural centres and clubs.

8 schools in the community received coloured wastesorting containers, purchased with the small grant funds.





In Novooleksandrivska community, active residents together with local government officials discussed strategic priorities of local development. They submitted their proposals for development projects and identified key concerns of the community to address them in the future strategy.

150 people from different villages were involved in interactive mapping of the development strategy.





In Yakymivska community, the family LEGO brick festival brought together local adults and children to share their vision of the community's future. In the course of the project, six LEGO festivals took place in five villages. They involved more than 150 residents aged from 3 to 77.

300 adults and kids helped to identify the brands of Yakymivska community and recreated them in LEGO

Honey community – educational project to promote beekeeping among rural youth

The project included a series of educational lectures and excursions to apiaries for school students of Shyrokivska community.

These events aimed to expand environmental awareness, foster a love of nature in children and youth, and increase their interest in beekeeping as a future career.

The project is implemented in collaboration with a cooperative organization, "BDZHOLAR", in Shyrokivska village territorial community of Zaporizhzhia region.

Ongoing projects

University of the 3rd Age – started in **November 2021** in Shakhivska village community of Donetsk region under the project "EU4 Resilient Regions – Special Assistance Programme Ukraine", provided by Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH on behalf of the Government of the Federal Republic of Germany.

Increasing the institutional capacity of Development Agencies – started in December 2021 for Chernihivska, Prymorska, Vasylivska and Yakymivska territorial communities of Zaporizhzhia region, within the project "Fostering economic participation of vulnerable groups, including IDP in the Sea of Azov region" provided by Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH.

In March-April 2022, after consultations with donors and partners, the project activities were specified to address the new needs and concerns of communities.

All the figures mentioned in this report were summarized by STEP's managers following the results of the relevant projects or were provided by local coordinators from partner communities.
